A few were assembled after the takeover by Rolls-Royce which bore a chassis plate 'Bentley Motors (1931) Ltd'. In 1986 Victoria Branch member Derek Hartley owned one of these rare models. He attended the RROCA Shepparton Rally at which it was listed as a 1932 Bentley, Chassis NoYA4078. Where is this car now?
